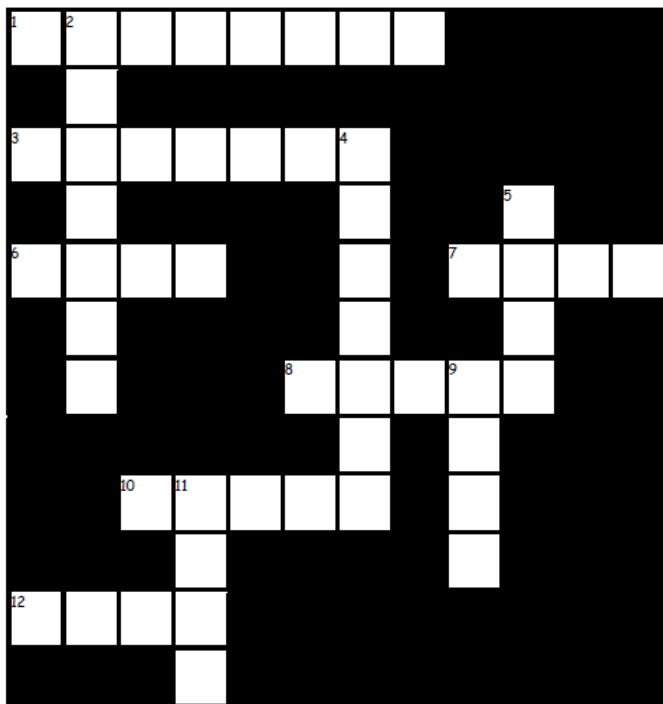

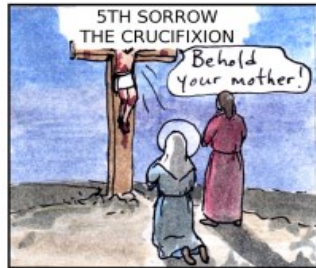
Our Lady of Sorrows
